

# **Order and Plan for Waterside (East of High Street) Upton upon Severn**

## **Statement of Reasons for proposing to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**

### **WORCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (WATERSIDE (EAST OF HIGH STREET) UPTON UPON SEVERN) (EXPERIMENTAL PROHIBITION OF DRIVING (EXCEPT FOR ACCESS))**

Worcestershire County Council have made this Order for facilitating the safe passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic and for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.

It is considered that that Order will contribute to the securing of the expeditious, safe and convenient movement of all traffic (including pedestrians) and will have no adverse effect on other considerations contained in S122 Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

# **The order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**

## **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 (AS AMENDED) WORCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (WATERSIDE (EAST OF HIGH STREET) UPTON UPON SEVERN) (EXPERIMENTAL PROHIBITION OF DRIVING (EXCEPT FOR ACCESSS) ORDER 2024**

Worcester County Council in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), 2 (1) and (3) and 4 (2) 9 Section 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act is hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1984”), and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

1. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed or wait on the following lengths of road in Upton upon Severn in the County of Worcestershire:

Waterside From its junction with High Street, eastwards for a distance of 65 metres.

2. In this order:

"Motor Vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on the roads as defined in Section 185 of the Road Traffic Act 1988 (“the 1988 Act”)

"Pedal Cycle" means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle or cycle having four or more wheels not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it has an electrically assisted pedal cycle of such class as to be treated as not being a Motor Vehicle for the purposes of the 1988 Act.

3. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to proceed or wait in the length of road referred to in that Article if the vehicle is being used for: -

- (a) for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;
- (b) vehicles if they cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, when being used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement to reconstruction of the lengths of roads referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; to include vehicles used by the Environment Agency in undertaking flood defence work, repair and maintenance.
  - (d) vehicles used by the Environment Agency in undertaking flood defence work, repair and maintenance;
  - (e) mechanical road cleansing vehicles;
  - (f) pedal cycles;
  - (g) vehicles requiring access to or being used in connection with premises or land fronting or accessed from and only from the said lengths of roads to which there is not a satisfactory alternative means of vehicular access;
  - (h) vehicles of a universal service provider (as defined in section 4(3) and (4) of the Postal Services Act 2000) delivering and/or collecting mail;
  - (i) vehicles requiring vehicular access for the purposes of delivering and collecting furniture or effect to and from affected premises provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with.
  - (j) refuse collection vehicles
3. This Order shall come into operation on the 13 June 2024 and may be cited as Worcestershire County Council (Waterside (East of High Street) Upton upon Severn) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving (Except for Access) Order 2024.

  - (g) vehicles requiring access to or being used in connection with premises or land fronting or accessed from and only from the said lengths of roads to which there is not a satisfactory alternative means of vehicular access;
  - (h) vehicles of a universal service provider (as defined in section 4(3) and (4) of the Postal Services Act 2000) delivering and/or collecting mail;
  - (i) vehicles requiring vehicular access for the purposes of delivering and collecting furniture or effect to and from affected premises provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with.
  - (j) refuse collection vehicles
3. This Order shall come into operation on the ~~XXXX~~ 23 May 13 June 2024 and may be cited as Worcestershire County Council (Waterside (East of High Street) Upton upon Severn) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving (Except for Access) Order 2024.
