University of Birmingham: PhD Research Project

Sheona Goodyear from University of Birmingham is undertaking a PhD Research project and is after input from Worcestershire DSL / Deputy DSL's.





'It could happen here' (Keeping Children Safe in Education): Could you share information to help schools support children who have been sexually abused?

This PhD research project investigates the disturbing social phenomena of intrafamilial child sexual abuse. I wish to add insight to existing knowledge of how girls in key stage 2 learn, play and cope at school, when they have experienced sexual abuse in their home environment. The aim is to improve understanding to help school staff to support and perhaps notice abused children who very often tell no-one about what is happening to them.

I would like to talk to staff who have worked with a key stage 2 girl known to have experienced sexual abuse at home. The conversation could be face to face at school or in an online meeting (whichever is most convenient) for roughly half an hour. I will not ask for any detail that could identify the girl and both your identity and the school's will be anonymised to protect the child.

Although your school will not be named in records of the research, I hope to share subsequent findings with you to benefit you, your school and educators broadly across the teaching community along with the children that rely on your support.

NCA: Financially motivated sexual extortion

The NCA (National Crime Agency) have produced a document for all educational settings to share with staff / parents and carers regarding financially motivated extortion.

Globally, there has been a large increase in reports of children and young people being forced into paying money or meeting another financial demand (such as purchasing a pre-paid gift card) after an offender has threatened to release nudes or semi-nudes of them. This is financially motivated sexual extortion, a type of online blackmail often referred to in the media as 'sextortion'. It is a form of child sexual abuse.

The document called "nca_financially_motivated_sexual_extortion_alert_education_eng" found in the google drive, listed below, provided education settings with guidance on how to recognise this form of abuse, how to respond and increase awareness.

- Tools to look after your own mental wellbeing
