PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION AND DEFINITIVE MAP MODIFICATION ORDER 2023

On 24th of June 2024, Worcestershire County Council confirmed the above order made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, and Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981.

The effect of the order, as confirmed, is to divert the footpath and modify the definitive map and statement for Worcestershire, accordingly.

From: a line running from: Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SO 8737 5523 (point A on the order plan). The footpath proceeds in a south easterly direction for 129 metres to OSGR SO 8748 5516 (point B on the order plan). As shown on the order plan. To: a line running from Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SO 8737 5523 (point A on the order plan). The footpath proceeds in a south south-westerly direction along new footway for 6 metres to OSGR SO 8737 5523 (point C on the order plan) where it turns to follow the footway in an east south-easterly direction for 67 metres to OSGR SO 8743 5521 (point D on the order plan). The path then follows the footway in a south south-westerly direction for 28 metres to OSGR SO 8743 5518 (point E on the order plan) and then east south-easterly along path for 39 metres to a gap in the fence line to terminate at the highway limit at OSGR SO 8746 5517 (point F on the order plan) as shown on the order plan.

The order comes into force as from 24th of June 2024, but if any person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act, has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 21st of August 2024, make an application to the High Court.
