PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION AND DEFINITIVE MAP MODIFICATION ORDER 2024 (2)

The above Order, made on 24 October 2024 under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, and Section 53A (2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, will divert the public footpath, and modify the definitive map and statement for Worcestershire accordingly:

From: a line running from Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SO 7481 5330 (point A on the order plan), in a northerly, then easterly direction to meet Folley Road at OSGR SO 7495 5329 (point B on the order plan). To: a line running from OSGR SO 7481 5330 (point A on the order plan) with a minimum width of 2 metres proceeding in an east southeasterly direction for 30 metres to OSGR SO 7484 5329 (point C on the order plan). It turns due east for 74 metres to OSGR SO 7492 5330 (point D on the order plan) where the width narrows slightly to a width of 1.9 metres for a further 30 metres to a pedestrian gate on Folley Road at OSGR SO 7495 5330 (point E on the order plan).
