Good afternoon. Thank you for allowing me to respond again at this late stage. I am deeply concerned, now more than ever about this proposal. I personally have had the misfortune of having a life long illness ,that has affected me all my adult life . I am now 71, so over 50 years. I was shielded during the pandemic, for over 14 months, as my drug treatment makes me immunosupressed. This is not heresay, I personally witnessed, during the pandemic, how many people used these footpaths, for their allowed excercise. They messaged me afterwards ,to say how safe they felt, keeping off the streets ,in amongst beautiful surroundings , which made them forget ,if only for a short while ,what was going on in the world around them . It also restored their mental heath and sanity . I live at The Bungalow ,Lea Castle Equestrian Centre, so being and living here also helped me. Our horses, were also allowed by law, at a later point to be excercised, which they also used the beautiful quiet bridleway. This was totally necessary ,as being stabled , if not ridden for weeks ,would have created huge problems, getting on again and working. As I travel the drive many times, I see how much traffic uses the B4189, yes a "B" Road, to get children to school, and also access the A449. The thought of so many HGV,s entering and exiting the site, onto already busy roads, is frankly both, proposterous and dangerous. It is also used by many motorhomes and caravans ,to get to the camping and caravan site ,next door , which is always full . I very much doubt it will be full , if a quarry is allowed to go ahead . I've spoken to many, as they have walked these paths and bridleways, and a lot live in close by towns and built up areas, why would they pay to come to somewhere next to a quarry. The simple answer is ,they wouldn't ,so another hospitality venue ,would suffer. That's just one of many. They struggled all through the pandemic to keep their businesses, now they are faced with this. I know a lot havnt come forward, simply because they are facing loss of revenue . I know we have and still will . Back to health issues, I know a lot of locals, moved to the area to retire, at great hardship and expense , to ease their medically condions ,ie asthma ,lung problems ,etc , in beautiful areas such as as these. Where does that leave them? Their final years, and I do mean final would be stressing about and living ,next door to a quarry . I personally ,have a medical, team ,come to me from the Q.E. Hospital in B, Ham ,every 6 weeks , for medication Infusions . My own medical notes now read ,2 life conditions ,bought on by medications , and stress bought on by a quarry proposal ,surrounding her home .I do understand the need for materials, but I certainly don't understand why it could be where it literally affects thousands of residents. After sitting and listening all week to arguments for and against, the againsts are the actual people who will have to live with it. The for, s, quite frankly don't have to live with it , they will all walk away ,I was t brave enough to speak at the inquiry, simply because I know how much it will affect the rest of my life, to probably the end of my life, and I also know, I would break down by talking about it. It hurts me so much . I'm actually in tears now ,just writing this . There is so much more wrong with this proposal, but I sincerely hope, you can see this for yourself. We have fought this proposal, as a community, for over 5 years, I really hope you reach the right conclusion, and end this now.
