To whom it concerns.

I am emailing with the utmost huge rejections to the planning permission that has once again been requested for the quarry.

Firstly, I have absolutely no idea why anyone would want to have such a huge mess in an otherwise beautiful area.

Dumping these mounds of sand and grit here will cause irreversible damage to wildlife and cattle in the local area.

Given the materials that are hoping to be placed in the area, it's an absolute outrage that the fact that the Silica dust that will be being produced isn't being taken as an emediate refusal point. This dust causes FAITAL lung disease. Not only will this be an incurable issue for live stock but take even a moment to consider the impact this dust will have on residents.

There are at least 5 schools that will all be in danger of these dust particles. This is 5 schools that are meant to be teaching and safeguarding our children. By attending such schools, if the quarry is to go ahead, we will be placing our children in imminent danger and risk of long lasting damage to their tiny lungs. The fact that peoples homes, work places, schools, playing areas will all be destroyed by this dust in the air, should surely mean that this goes down as an immense health and safety risk factor for allowing this to continue?

Given that this has been refused on several occasions, i simply do not know or understand how or why it is that this has been allowed to be submitted once again! There is no new evidence to suggest any major health and safety alterations that would prevent astronomical increase in large vehicle activity in the area. Similarly, there is no evidence to support the air safety and quality of the areas current state.
