Dear Colleagues,

I hope you've been having a good week.

As many of your will know we held our Head Teacher briefing this week where we saw over 90 colleagues join us for the termly system leadership updates. Whilst we are all working in challenging times it is energising and so positive to see and hear about the system collaboration for children in Worcestershire.

The Department for Education is seeking feedback on the revised <u>'Use of Reasonable Force and Other Restrictive Interventions in Schools' guidance</u>. The guidance aims to help schools meet new statutory requirements, including recording and reporting significant incidents of force from September 2025. It also focuses on minimising the need for restrictive interventions, supporting staff in using force safely and lawfully, and ensuring safeguarding responsibilities are met - particularly for pupils with SEND. Share your views and help shape this important policy on the <u>Department for Education website</u>.

From 31st March 2025, all schools in England must separate and recycle food waste, glass, metal, plastic, paper, and cardboard. Food waste must be collected separately to reduce landfill waste. Schools should prepare by setting up dedicated recycling bins. For more information please read the following government blog on getting your school or trust ready for new recycling regulations.

The COVID-19 Day of Reflection 2025 will take place on Sunday 9th March 2025. This is an opportunity for communities across the country to come together in reflection and commemoration for lives lost and for everyone impacted by the pandemic. Through the <u>Turing Scheme</u>, the government provides education providers with funding to support their students to do study and work placements around the world.

Funding is open to UK organisations from across the education and training sector, including:

- schools (applying on behalf of primary and secondary pupils)
- further education provider (applying on behalf of sixth form students)
- higher education providers

Applications for the academic year 2025 to 2026 are now open and close at 4:00pm on 14th March.

To ensure compliance with 'Working together to Improve School attendance' statutory guidance updates (August 2024), we are offering two further training courses to support schools when considering escalation procedures to secure regular attendance:

Senior attendance leads and school attendance staff who have not completed these courses within the last six months are recommended to join.

Free DfE Attendance Conference for Worcestershire Secondary schools.

Secondary schools in Worcestershire have received an invitation to a free, in person conference on *Breaking Down Barriers to Opportunity: Transforming Attendance*, hosted by the Department for Education. These conferences will take place in each of the 9 regions in England from March.

The West Midlands conference date for secondary schools in Worcestershire to attend is **Friday 7**th **March 2025.**

As school leaders or senior attendance champions in secondary schools please do sign up for your local conference, which is intended to make a real difference to school-level practice, drawing on the latest insight, including the sector-led attendance toolkit and the principles in the Working Together guidance. By way of background, these conferences are the first of a series of planned events on school level practice. The first regional conferences are targeted at <u>school leaders or senior attendance champions in secondary schools</u> - reflecting that that is where the challenge is currently greatest – so for phase one of recruitment the conferences are only open to secondary school attendance leaders.

We completely recognise the importance of ensuring LA teams and primary schools benefit from the same messages around attendance and will be in touch about plans for LAs and/or primaries at a later date. We are also developing a conference specifically for responsible bodies in the Summer term targeted at LAs and trusts. In the meantime, DfE's <u>attendance youtube channel</u> includes links to our library of best practice.

Education Endowment Fund Launches Spring 2025 Funding Round

The Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) is accepting applications to its Spring 2025 round which is focused on improving outcomes for Post-16 learners, particularly those from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds, in England.

EEF is seeking programmes that are developed and ready to be evaluated.

Applications may cover multiple priority areas and sub-themes (full details are within the guidance notes) but must address at least one of the following priority areas:

- Attendance
- EdTech and AI
- GCSE results
- Transition from school to college

Programmes can be general or subject specific, across academic and technical qualifications, with the exception of apprenticeships, which sit outside of the EEF's remit.

This funding round is open to developers of programmes that seek to improve outcomes for post-16 learners and align with one or more of the Spring 2025 priority areas and sub-themes. Any legally constituted organisation working with children and young people between the ages of two to 19 can apply.

The Spring 2025 application window is open from 29th January 2025 to 14th March 2025 (11am).

National Professional Qualifications (NPQs)

Applications for NPQs are now open, and funded places are being allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Please register on the DfE's NPQ portal to secure any relevant funding.

Want to improve staff retention?

For those who already have an NPQ, consider how to keep the progression going by setting targets which build on NPQ skills and link to your SIP.

Want to improve inclusion?

The <u>NPQ SENCO</u> is a fully-funded leadership qualification open to current or aspirant senior leaders, **not just SENCOs**.

By having more than one member of your school leaders trained on the NPQ SENCO, your school can develop a distributed leadership model that allows for succession planning as well as tackling bigger SEND and inclusion issues.
