## Worcestershire County Economic Summary

**Comment:** The Claimant Count increased in January 2025 by 245 to 11,670 and the number of claimants aged 18-24 increased by 85 to 2,110. The Worcestershire rate (Ages 16-64) of 3.2% is lower than that of the West Midlands (5.6%) and England (4.3%).

In May 2024, the Department for Work and Pensions increased the administrative earnings threshold for full work search conditionality. This change increased the Claimant Count at the time of the change. This will impact the 'change on last year' figures.

## About these statistics

- The Claimant Count includes all Universal Credit claimants who are required to seek work and be available for work, as well as all Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) claimants. Under Universal Credit a broader span of claimants are required to look for work than under JSA.
- 2. In May 2024, the Department for Work and Pensions increased the administrative earnings threshold for full work search conditionality. This change affected around 180,000 claimants nationally, increasing the Claimant Count at the time of the change. This policy change, along with two previous increases to the administrative earnings threshold in September 2022 and January 2023, represents discontinuities in the Claimant Count series.
- 3. Claimant Count rates or proportions express the number of claimants in an area/group as a percentage of the mid-2021 resident population estimates in that area/group.
- 4. Individual figures are rounded to the nearest 5, and as a result may not sum to the rounded totals.
- 5. The Claimant Count data is calculated on a monthly basis and is released in the first half of the following month. The data release shows the provisional figures for the latest full month's data and revised figures for the previous month. For example: the data release for August would show provisional Claimant Count figures for July and revised figures for June.
