Child exploitation awareness- Intelligence form reminder

South Worcester Child Exploitation team are reaching out to schools across south Worcestershire to remind them of an intelligence form whereby schools who have exploitation concerns for specific children can share information with police. This form has been in existence for a while now, however it is imperative for the safeguarding of children to adopt a partnership working approach. This form can include as little information such as the known associates of the child.

The safety of a child is our priority, and it is important that any information shared is explained properly. We would need to know who the source of the information is, where the information has come from, who else knows this information, and how old or new this information is.

It is important that if a young person is the only person to know that information and there is a chance that they could be compromised, or their safety be put at risk by sharing information, that it is made obvious on the intelligence form. Police can deal with these types of matters very sensitively.

Schools hold a lot of information which could be the difference between disrupting exploitation early, and for a child to get their life back on track.

- To be confident when to share/not share and/or seek advice about information sharing.
- To be confident in undertaking an Early Help Assessment

Effective Governance to Support School Attendance *NEW*

This training course explores the role of governors in ensuring schools are meeting their statutory duties relative to attendance. As all schools are required to deliver new statutory expectations to meet DfE 'Working Together to Improve School Attendance' requirements, this course will enable governors to provide support and challenge to drive improvement.

The course aims to assist governors to:

- Explore the governance core functions and their relevance to attendance
- Review how DfE attendance expectations and statutory duties are met
- Champion and support the promotion of attendance through policy and ethos
- Review data, challenge trends and support leaders to focus on strategies towards improvement
- Ensure staff receive adequate training and access to good practice guidance

Early years and childcare designated safeguarding lead (DSL) training

This training is specifically for the Designated Safeguarding Lead, Deputy DSL or those who are looking to become the DSL / Deputy DSL in early years and childcare settings across Worcestershire. The training has been devised to support DSL's who are new to the role, experienced and extremely experienced.

Content is updated regularly and includes a detailed look at signs and symptoms, legislation, guidance and responsibilities, record keeping, making referrals, multi-agency working, child protection meetings, serious case reviews, and exploring barriers to good practice.
